EC New Legislative Framework Alignment Package

The Following message is relayed by Peter Chadwick G3RZP from Thilo DL9KCE. Peter asks that this be included below, and will advise us of further developments.

As part of the New Legislative Framework (NLF) Alignment Package, the European Commission is reworking some directives. One of the affected directives is the EMC directive including some major changes. Most of them are neutral or even good from an amateur radio operators perspective. However, there are two slight changes piggyback carried, which very much affect us. Briefly:

- 1. The sentence "Kits of components to be assembled by radio amateurs and commercial equipment modified by and for the use of radio amateurs are not regarded as commercially available equipment." is to be deleted in the new version. That would render kits and modified equipment to be fully subjected to the EMC directive.
- 2. The definition of the term 'electromagnetic disturbance' will include the wanted signal of a radio as a possible source. This is not in line with the radio regulation of the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) and not in line with the vocabulary of the International Electrotechnical Committee (IEC).

IARU Region 1 will respond to it with a letter soon.

However, we strongly suggest that you contact your local MEPs and tell them about those two changes in the EMCD, that are neither in line with the reasoning of the New Legislative Framework, nor does it help to improve protection of radio services or equipment.

I have recently come across 2 items of Racal manufacture that I cannot trace, or find a reason for their existence. They are as follows:

MA 978F Charger This charger can charge 6 batteries at a time, and has a curious 2 pin plug on the end of every charge lead. The case of the charger looks as though it dates from when the Syncal 30 was first produced. I have not found any reference to it in any brochures or on the Internet.

MA 4705 Battery Again, no hint of any information.
