#### Armed Forces Weekend Bletchley Park, 3<sup>rd</sup>/4<sup>th</sup> September 2011

The arrangements will be the same as last year, and final details will appear in the July News Sheet. ### Fritton Lake D-Day Celebration

A new annual event for military history buffs was held at the two-day Fritton Lake D-Day Celebration, held at Fritton Lake Country Park, close to the Somerleyton Estate near Great Yarmouth in Norfolk. As the venue is only 2 miles from my QTH, I decided to take a look at what vehicles and activities were there. I went with my wife and two friends on Saturday 4<sup>th</sup> June but was told that Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> June was the best day and, on my way to the Spalding Rally the next day, I saw a lot of other vintage military vehicles heading to the Park.

Fritton Lake was the site of 'swimming tank' trials during WWII and the site was top secret, the details only emerging many years after the war was over. There was a lecture program held in an ex-army tent for those interested in the history of the site and about 30 military vehicles were there along with a US Airborne re-enactment group, the latter dugin in the woods bordering the lake.

The photos attached show a Royal Navy jeep fitted with a WS-19 and with a WS-18 lurking in the encampment behind, plus a BC-620(?) equipped jeep.



The highlight of the day for me was the two fully-operational DUKWs which went for a cruise around the lake, flying the red duster for some reason!

I chatted to a few vehicle owners and some of the reenactment people and, generally, had a good day in the lovely weather. There was a large grassed area bordered by mature trees where the military vehicles were on show and it occurred to me that a vintage radio display would have been ideally suited for such a gathering. Perhaps some of us East Anglian Members could get together and propose a display to the organisers for next year? Fritton Lake is a family park and there is plenty to do and see for all ages. It lies close to the south-eastern edge of the Norfolk Broads, on the A143 road. There is a hotel and restaurant on site for those with deep pockets.

As you might recall, Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> June was somewhat of a wash out, but it certainly did not dampen the spirits of all who attended. The Day is designed to cater for those Past and Present of the Regiment, and any family and friends.

Anne and I were delighted to be joined by at least two VMARS Members. They are fellow Committee Member Ian Underwood M0YMK and his wife Carolyn, and Les Thacker 2E0IBN. Grateful thanks are due to Carolyn for the picnic that was so beautifully arranged. We were lucky enough to share a few bottles of bubbly to set the day off, and toast the fallen; then it was down to business.

With the inclement weather, I had to call upon my contacts in the Regiment's Signal Platoon, to loan me a  $9 \times 9$ Penthouse (a command post shelter), so that at least I could keep the older radio equipment dry, and also the two deactivated weapons that were on display. I don't think they were on the table for more than 5 minutes at a time before another person wanted to have a look. My thanks to Les Thacker for the loan of an SMG, the Infantry Signallers' weapon during my tenure. I took my own 7.62 mm deactivated SLR.

Radio equipment, on display, was the WS 22 Xtal controlled version, complete with PSU, the WS 62, a spare valves case (with spares), and a remote control box. Outside getting wet from time to time, was an SR A41 No 2, complete and working with one of the famous Mario Inverters from Italy, an SR A13 HP complete and working with batteries from the modern bits of kit 12 V 2.2 AHC batteries (very lightweight). I forget the kit, perhaps it was IRIS perimeter protection?

A Racal PRM 4700, VHF set (30-109.975 MHz), made under licence by Sapura in Malaysia, and a Plessey RT 1861 patrol set (very rare). I think Andy G8JAC has one, but again working with battery cassette, and tactical antenna.

The Lightweight Landrover certainly pulled its weight, and I did a round trip of some 350 miles, including local mileage. It was, however, very very thirsty; I spent somewhere in the region of £166-ouch!

The vehicle, was sporting the Racal Syncal 2000, and Racal Panther 2000-V, both fully operational. The Grenadiers did a couple more things for me. I rather stupidly left a carrier bag at home containing my dipole antenna and feeder, so I borrowed a Kevlar type dipole. Also, we strapped a 8 m mast to the back of the Bowman Wolf FFR, suitably positioned right next door, so you could see the past and present. The Grenadiers had a 9 x 9 and the Wolf was cammed up, the Penthouse used as a command post with all the computers and remote equipment displayed on tables, but working, Oh no! much too classified, even an old sweat like me was not allowed to guard it during the morning set up, before we opened for the day. Perhaps they thought I would take too much of a liking to it-Hi Hi.

Contacts, I have to say, were few and far between; it was the usual excuses when running a display station. There were too many people to talk to, children coming to have their photos taken, with radio kit and Lcpl Sparks (Mannequin).

However, it must be mentioned that successful contact was made into the Saturday Morning AM Net, on the day before. I was using the SR A13 HP with its battlefield whip. I was heard not only by Bronek MODAF who was controlling, but also by Mike G4EJM and a weak signal was also received in the Netherlands by Trevor PA3BOH, remarkable when you think about it, but that's Grenadier training!

You must realise that I was using the whip, as the Grenadiers did not give me the Kevlar dipole till 11.30 a.m.!

5 MHz was also operated on Saturday with the Syncal 2000 and the 16' whip, when I received a 5/9 from Peter G8BLS in Suffolk, then again on the Saturday from the dipole when I received 5/7, and Peter was also good copy.

I am hoping to make it a better display next time, and I may extend invitations out to more (I had to test the water with Security Threat levels *etc.*), but it was a great day, and thanks to all including Anne who sadly pranged her car the following morning on the M3, writing it off. Thankfully, she was OK!

### From Tony Helm G4BCX

# RAF Harrowbeer 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary 13-14<sup>th</sup> August

As previously mentioned, RAF Harrowbeer, near Plymouth, is holding its 70<sup>th</sup> Anniversary on the w/e August 13/14<sup>th</sup>.

I have now completed the arrangements for the above activity, and I would ask any Member who could be interested in attending this event to contact Michael Hayes on 01822 853679, e-mail on knightstonetea@yahoo.co.uk, copy to me on tony.helm@blueyonder.co.uk, to clarify any points. If you contact me in the first instance I can send you a copy of my proposal to the Committee and also the organiser's risk assessment. These will give you full details. Please pay special attention to the Health and Safety requirements.

I have applied to the Committee for VMARS support in order to obtain fuel allowance, as I appreciate that many Members will be put off by the travelling costs. Unfortunately the Committee is expecting me to waste a lot of time duplicating the organiser's H&S efforts, Q&A sessions and involve me in a lot of totally un-necessary paperwork, something which I am not prepared to waste my time doing, as, *inter alia*, I have two other displays to work on. I have, therefore, cancelled my application.

Notwithstanding the above, I offer you a good week-end, with a variety of radio activity, plenty of family attractions and a very nice location. A very worthwhile addition to a West-Country family holiday.

### **Response from the Committee**

We can but express amazement and deep disappointment with Tony Helm's letter and wish to set the record straight on this matter. Safety is not a waste of time.

As Members will know, we have a clear policy on VMARS support for exhibits at shows and rallies. Committee agreement is required to any application for support and such agreement accesses the Society's Public Liability and Loss or Damage Insurance. When such agreement is given, the Committee deems the person making the application to be the 'Authorised Person' responsible for all aspects of the proposed exhibit.

Safety is, of course, paramount and particularly so where members of the public visit the exhibit. By authorising VMARS support for an exhibit, the Committee also accepts responsibility on behalf of the Society for the safety aspects of the exhibit. It is a well known principle that responsibility for safety cannot be delegated but duties in respect of safety management may be delegated. As it is not practical for the Committee to be involved in the detailed planning and safety management of every proposed exhibit, the Committee deems the 'Authorised Person' to have the delegated duty of ensuring safe operation of the exhibit on the day and the delegated duty of ensuring that safety is fully considered during the planning phases of the exhibit and, where the exhibit is part of a larger event, this could include ensuring compliance with any safety requirements the main event organisers may impose as part of their safety management policy.

While the Society's Public Liability and Loss or Damage insurance does not require the Society to prepare any particular formal documentation in respect of safety, there is an expectation that safety will be fully considered in the planning and operation of an exhibit or activity for which insurance cover is sought. Flowing from this there is an expectation that the Society will co-operate fully with the main event organiser's safety policy and comply with any requirements that may be imposed as part of that policy. This could well include the preparation of Risk Assessments and attendance at any Safety Meetings or Briefings the organisers may hold.

It is clear that those seeking to stage a VMARS exhibit at a public event must take into account the work load involved. The Committee will always try to help or offer advice wherever possible but the detail must come in the first instance from those planning the exhibit.

The RAF Harrowbeer event is the first occasion on which VMARS has been issued with formal safety documentation. This made it clear that specialist exhibitors (such as VMARS) were expected to have Risk Assessments in place covering general safety, electrical safety and fire safety for their exhibits. We indicated to Tony Helm that we would need to see his drafts for these documents before final Committee approval could be given, and mentioned the particular aspects of the exhibit he would need to cover. We also explained to Tony that this was the first time that VMARS have been asked to supply Risk Assessments and that he was breaking new ground. Disappointingly, Tony responded in terms, similar to those used in his letter above, making it clear that he had no intention of co-operating with the Committee in producing the Risk Assessments required. He considered that he had provided sufficient information in the 'narrative' part of his proposal. While this outlined, in general terms, what was proposed it did not provide enough detail to produce meaningful Risk Assessments. We would have been only too happy to work with Tony but he gave us no opportunity to do so and there was little else the Committee could do. The Risk Assessments were in no way a duplication of the main event organiser's health and safety management, but an important contribution to it.

As your Committee, we very much regret what has happened and must make it clear that responsibility for this situation does not rest with the Committee. We can only apologise to Members who were expecting to visit a VMARS exhibit at the RAF Harrowbeer event.

#### Disposing of vintage equipment

The Society often receives enquiries from non-members (or their relatives), *via* the website, asking for our advice about disposing of vintage equipment. In many cases, the enquirers have no idea of what the equipment is worth but often their main concern is that it should go to a good home rather than be scrapped. My advice has been to suggest that we place an ad in the News Sheet for them on a 'Best Offer' basis, and this has been accepted by a number of

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enquirers recently. However I was contacted by one such enquirer who had placed an ad in last month's News Sheet who tells me that he was called by (presumably) a Member and discussed at length the details of the equipment and agreed a price only to be told "I'll think about it". This left him somewhat disillusioned considering the time spent in conversation, and I would agree with him. Come on folks, play the game – if you're sufficiently interested in something to make the call, and agree the price, complete the deal with good grace. The alternative is for us to advise future enquirers to put the item on Ebay and be done with it.
